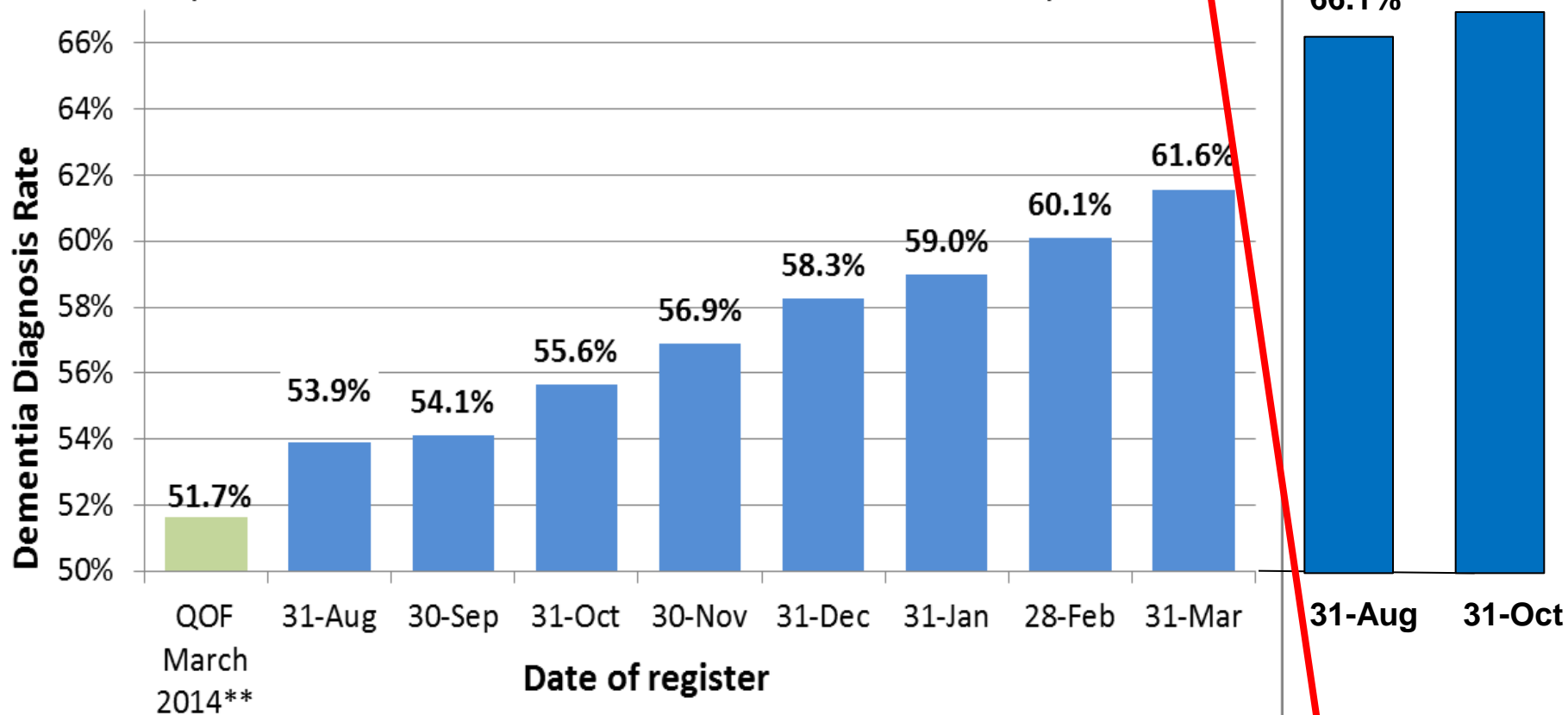

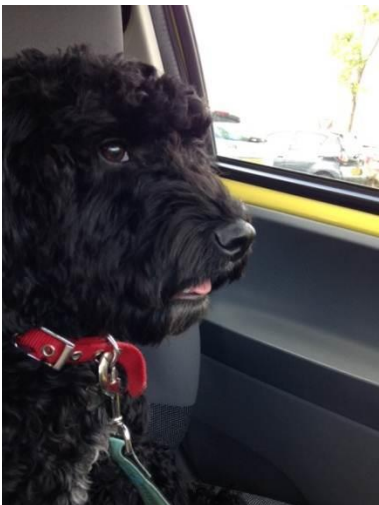

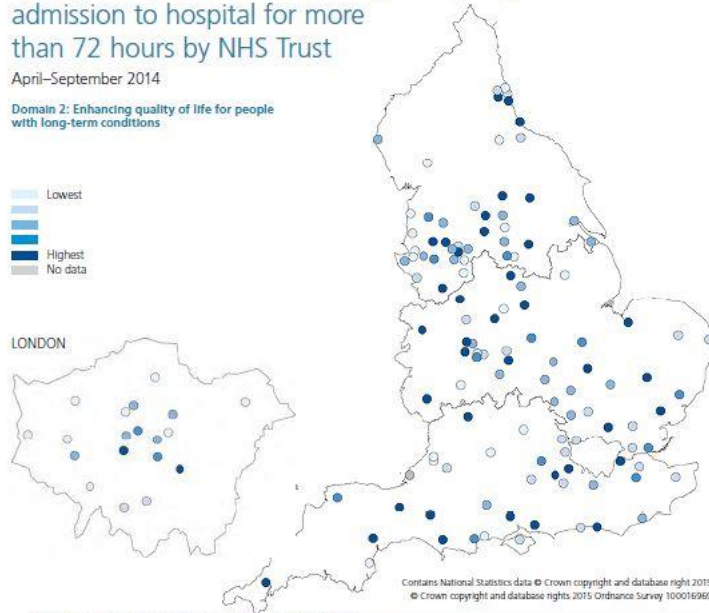

April–September 2014

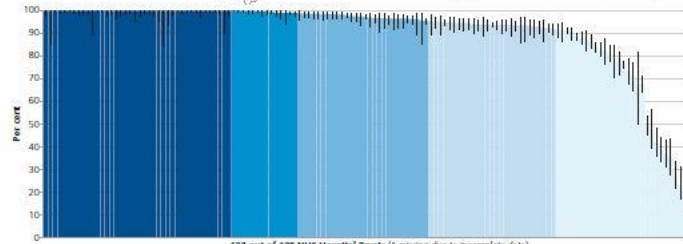

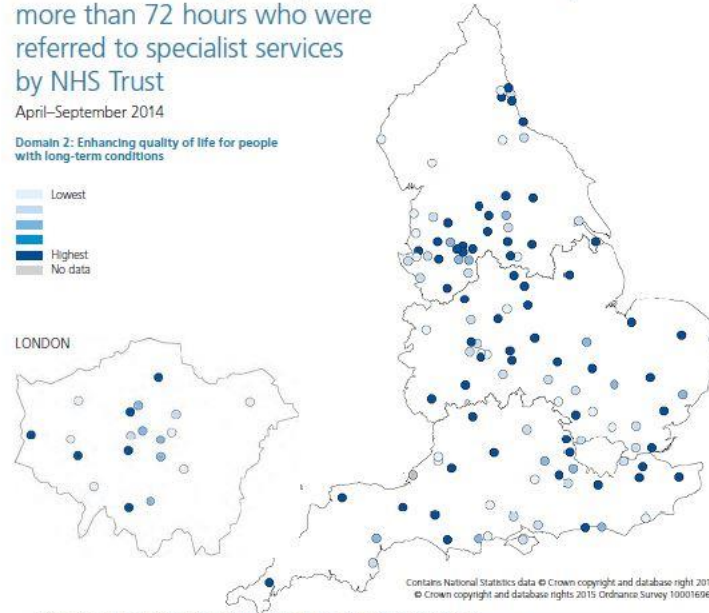

April–September 2014

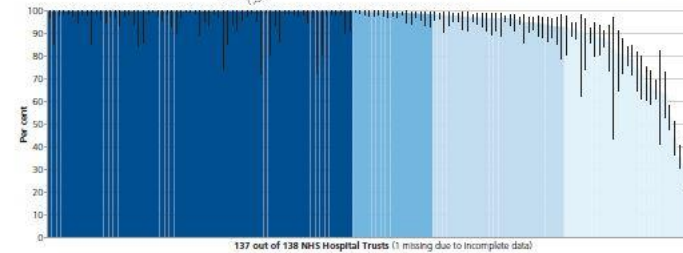
